When your body is tired, be okay with stopping what you're doing and just rest. Take that nap, sit down for twenty minutes and just do nothing. Take a walk and just breathe fresh air. Take a break. Life will still be waiting afterwards."

Partnership Spotlight: Lubbock Impact

Lubbock Impact is in our Spotlight for June! Their mission statement is: "To transform lives, renew minds and educate families." Life can be hard and challenging especially when you must provide for others, or it is just you and you just need a hot meal to get you through to the next day. At Lubbock Impact, they offer 15 different programs that help the those less fortunate or who had fallen on hard times. Their biggest program they offer to the public is the soup kitchen. This kitchen operates once a week from 5-6pm on Wednesday evenings. The kitchen will feed around 270-300 people. Other ministries that are offered include a hygiene closet, clothing closet, shoe closet, food vouchers, dental clinic, free medical clinic, pharmacy, social services and spiritual growth. Did we mention all these services

are FREE!!! Yes FREE, because at Lubbock Impact, their vision is to minister to people in the areas of food, clothing, healthcare and spiritual growth. We chose Lubbock Impact as our partnership spotlight because they are a one stop shop and they have helped HCOC in many ways since the beginning, including allowing us to hold our services in their building. They saw our passion for helping and educating the youth of tomorrow and wanted to help us achieve that goal. Lubbock Impact also donated their parking lot so we could hold our 2nd annual Summer Bash, which was a great success!! We support the work Lubbock Impact is doing and want to help spread the word about this awesome resource for the Lubbock community. Lubbock Impact is currently getting ready for a showing of Loud Krazy Love, a

documentary about musician Brian Welch and his life through drug abuse and redemption, the showing is open to the public. Lubbock impact is also in need for a new Air Conditioning Unit A total replacement of the AC at Lubbock Impact will cost \$65,546.44 and add to a ministry that helps thousands.
